Scholarship program: The society paid tuition for 5 students (2 from the Junior Secondary School and 3 from the Senior Secondary School) in the Sinkunia community. These students were identified by the Scholarship Committee as worthy and above average performers beset with extreme financial difficulties, which otherwise would have prevented them from affording the tuition on their own; thus deterring them from realizing their full potentials. But with support from the SCDO scholarship fund, the five students are currently enrolled in full time school. We intend to support them to any level of education of their choice.

Relief Items: With support from the Alberta Distribution Relief Agency (ADRA), the society provided used clothes to 100 students from the Junior and Senior Secondary Schools and 50 elders in the Sinkunia community last year. In addition, the society donated 10 bicycles to students who had to trek 3 miles every day to come to school in the Sinkunia community. We also donated 10 beds and bedding to the community health centre. Shipment of the relief items was made possible by donations from our generous donors.

Clean water supply: Early last year, the society completed the construction of one well in the Sinkunia community. The well is presently providing clean source of water to over 50 families in the community. The Manitoba Council for International Cooperation awarded \$5,000 to the society for the initial phase of the construction of the well. Our generous donors contributed an additional \$5,000 for the completion of the project

Community Farm: This year, the society invested in mechanized farming in Sinkunia. The focus of this investment is food security and self-sufficiency at the community level. With an anticipated bumper harvest, we intend to support the Primary School Lunch Program, feed the elderly, and provide seed and food for work to struggling farmers. Our focus in the coming year is to work with the Department of Agriculture in Sierra Leone to acquire a tractor to expand and sustain the community farm into the future.

Micro credit for women: The purpose of the micro-credit is to empower local women to be self-sufficient and financially independent. Most recently, funds from a Fundraising Dinner, and sale from donated books and art work, were used to set up and provide micro credit to 5 women in the Sinkunia community. Profits generated from the micro-business will go towards the education of their children and feed their families. Also, the profits will be ploughed back into the local economy for sustainable community development. The revolving credit will be awarded bi-annually to trustworthy and deserving women. This will ensure sustainability of the micro-credit scheme.
